

A Message from Pastor Lavy. . .

In February I gave a sermon on Luke 6:27-38. Jesus tells us in verse 27 that we are to love our enemies, “But I say unto you that hear, love your enemies, do good to those who hate you.” It got me thinking, who exactly are our enemies? The word enemies occurs 140 times in the New Testament. Jesus here is implying that we all have enemies. In war we know who our enemies are. I am sure Ukraine thinks of Russia as an enemy. I find it hard to believe that humanity hasn't found a better word for people we don't get along with other than a word laced with negativity and militaristic connotations. When I think of enemies, the image that comes to mind is war, violence, death and destruction.

So again, I ask you, who are your enemies? Jesus tells us our enemies include anyone who oppresses, mistreats or harms us. This may include religious people and even those who may have different political and personal beliefs. Why is Jesus telling us to love these people, can't we just ignore them and pretend they're not there? Jesus tells us to love them because he wants us to remember God's love for all people. Jesus expects us, Christians, to live by a higher standard than non-believers. If we don't love, how do we show what Jesus has done in our lives?

The next question should be, “How can we love our enemies?” First, we must pray for them, pray that they will one day see the light of God the way we have. We need also to be good to those that hate us. This starts by looking at people without judging them for who they are or how they live. The best way to do this is by showing them grace just as God has shown us grace.

When I finished this newsletter message, I went back and reflected on it. The important issue here is that Jesus is not asking us, He is commanding us, yes commanding, to love our enemies. He's telling us to unconditionally love everyone. There is way too much hate in this world, it is our duty and commandment to be different, because love is the only thing that can stop hate.
